

Humanitarian Response in Armenia

Helping those displaced by the conflict in Nagorno-Karabakh

Since the very beginning of the recent armed clashes in Nagorno-Karabakh, PIN has focused on helping the displaced people to meet their basic needs. We have provided hygiene kits to more than 1,200 families in Syunik, Ararat, Armavir, and Tavush regions of Armenia.

Moreover, 480 children, 600 women, and 110 seniors have received individual kits for personal hygiene.

We have also focused on COVID-19 protection measures and public health awareness raising through information leaflets and public notices. [READ MORE](#)

Rapid Response to COVID-19

As part of the "EU COVID-19 Solidarity Programme for the Eastern Partnership", PIN Armenia announced rapid response call to address the immediate COVID-related health and social needs of the most vulnerable groups. The particular focus is displaced civilians including spontaneous arrivals to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19. As a result, the "Mission Armenia BNGO", "Yeghvard" youth and environmental NGO, "Kamq" Lori youth projects center NGO, "Improve Our Village" NGO, "Generations Solidarity" NGO, "Astghvard" NGO, "ABCD Innovation Center" NGO and "Contribution to women and children" NGO are selected as winners – they will provide hygiene kits to about 10 000 people (2500 vulnerable families).
